Florida Phase 1 Priorities (Revised 12/23 per Executive Order 20-315)

Long-Term Care Facility residents and staff

Persons 65 years of age and older

Health care personnel with direct patient contact

Vaccine Key Points

- Moderna COVID-19 vaccinations distribution started on Monday, January 4, 2021 for individuals 65 plus and health care workers with direct patient contact and who aren't affiliated with a hospital system
 - At this time, all appointments have been filled. There is no wait list and walk-ups are not accepted
 - As additional vaccine doses are received, more appointments will be made available
 - Everyone's patience is appreciated
- Individuals receiving a vaccine are required to bring:
 - [COVID-19 Vaccine Screening and Consent Form](#)
 - Identification form (driver's license, passport, healthcare badge, etc.)
 - Vaccine appointment ticket (only applicable to those who made their appointments via the on-line registration)
 - A Doctor's consent letter is required for those who
 - Dose quantity/accessibility will determine appointment availability. New appointments will be released as additional vaccines are confirmed.
- New vaccine appointment notifications will be issued by press release, social media, and via alerts that you can receive on your mobile phone from the AlertBrevard.
 - To register for text alerts, simply create a new text message on your mobile phone to **888777** and in the text message body write **BrevardEOC** and hit send.

(State Operated Site)

- Drive-through, no appointment required
- Monday – Sunday, 9 AM to 5 PM
- 250 Community College Parkway. (Use the entrance from San Filippo Dr. SE & Jupiter Blvd.)
- Testing available for adults and children of all ages
- Rapid antigen tests with results in as soon as 15 minutes now available
- Insurance information will be requested but is not required to receive a test
 - There will be no copay or any fee charged
- Identification is no longer required but does expedite the process

Parrish

8 THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT THE U.S. COVID-19 VACCINE PROGRAM

1. The safety of COVID vaccines is a top priority
2. COVID-19 vaccination will help protect you from getting COVID-19. Two doses are needed for the vaccines that are currently available.
3. Right now, CDC recommends COVID-19 vaccines be offered to healthcare personnel and residents of long-term care facilities.
4. There is currently limited supply of COVID-19 vaccine in the U.S., but supply will increase in the weeks and months to come.
5. After COVID-19 vaccination, you may have some side effects. This is a normal sign that your body is building protection.
6. Cost is not an obstacle to getting vaccinated against COVID-19.
7. The first COVID-19 vaccine is being used under an Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) from the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA).
8. COVID-19 vaccines are one of many important tools to help us stop this pandemic.
